Dr. Jamison (Jamie) L. Work has served as a pastor and international missionary for 42 years in five churches, three states and in two foreign countries. While serving as a pastor in the U.S., Dr. Work sponsored three successful church plants, started two Christian schools, and initiated a Church Planting and Theological Training Institute. He and his wife served with the IMB for three years in the Middle East.

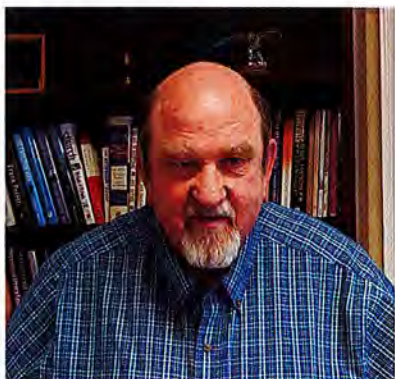
Dr. Work has led a church revitalization project and led three of the five churches he pastored to sponsor church planting projects. He has also written a 40-Day Church Revitalization Prayer Guide that is broadly used across several state conventions. He has served in various leadership roles within the local association, State Conventions, as well as the SBC. He has been heavily involved in local associational life in Texas, Georgia, and Tennessee, from Moderator to strategic planning teams. He has served on the Executive Board of the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board, and on the SBC Executive Committee.

The heartbeat of Work's ministry has been discipling, equipping, and mobilizing believers to embrace God's call to disciple the nations, with special emphasis on the least-reached and unreached peoples in the 10/40 Window. He has personally led mission teams or mobilized other believers to carry the Good News to approximately 30 states and more than 25 international locations. Work's last pastorate in the U.S. commissioned more than 50 people to go live on the international mission field and saw more than 100 people participate every year in short-term mission projects in the US and around the globe during his 18 years as their pastor.

Currently, Work serves as one of two IMB Associational Network Strategists. His assignment is with Associational leaders in the Eastern half of the U.S. He is available to assist Associational leaders in everything from missions training events, resources, adopting unreached people groups, missionary connections, partnerships, Mission Conferences, preaching and speaking, leading AMS / DOM Cohorts for International Missions, Acts 1:8 organization, diaspora peoples, prayer partnerships, missions preaching, or anything else connected to our Global assignment from the Lord Jesus.

Hello, my name is Jaime Tang and I'm your SYBA Ministry Coordinator. I just want to start by saying thank you to all of you. Your role as volunteers, as givers, as pray-ers, continues to be used by God to make His name known in our area, and beyond. So thank you for what you did this past year and how you continue to allow God to use you.

I want to recap the numbers from each of the ministries in the past year so we can celebrate together how God is working:

Fair Ministry 2024:

785 meals served

178 onsite volunteers

59 hygiene bags

11 free hair cuts

3 English and 5 Spanish Bibles given

Dates for this year's fair ministry are August 28-September 6. If you're not already committed to something and would like to be, please see me at the missions fair after this meeting.

Toy Store for Jesus 2024:

333 families served

1176 children received toys

15 salvations

8 rededications

For 2025:

Our website now has the volunteer sign-ups available for this year. Dates for this year's toy distribution are: December 4, 5, 6 in Davie County and December 16, 18, 19, and 20 in Iredell county. If you'd like to go ahead and sign up to volunteer, please come see me at the Mission Fair and we can get you signed up today. I will also have printed donation requests for toys available as well if you'd like to drop by and pick up a flyer. And a reminder that all children receive \$50 worth of toys in their bags, so if your church would like to promote Toys for Jesus "sponsorship" of a child, \$50 would sponsor 1 child for this Christmas.

Food Pantry

Aug 2024 - July 2025:

- 4442 Individuals
- 1226 Families
- 44 Salvations, 2 rededications

- Overall, this represents a 40% increase in the number of people served by our food pantry. That is on TOP of the 45% increase that we saw last year.

Changes at the FP:

- Families can now make their own appointments by using an app or by texting a number to make an appointment. By making this change, we've reduced the number of people needing to make an appointment by phone to 5-10 people a week.
- We were able to get Second Harvest donations this year, even with no changes made to how we provide services. This allows us to get a lot of meat, bread, and produce for free or cheap. It does not provide for all of the shelf stocked items.

How much:

- You may be wondering, Jaime, how much does it cost to feed a family for a month from our food pantry? A small family of, say, a single mother and a child is about \$50 a month. Whereas a large family of 2 parents and 4 children is about \$100 a month.
- This idea of "sponsoring a family" or "feeding a family" for a month is something you can take back to your church. Donations can be given to your church for this or online through our sybaptist website.
- Come see me at the missions fair if you would like more information about collecting money or food items for the food pantry.

Sharing 1 story of someone who accepted Christ this year:

In January, we had a long-time guest accept Christ. She's probably met with about every Encourager we have over the years. But that day, she met an Encourager who had never served at the Food Pantry before. He said he asked her about her salvation and going to church. BAppalachian Backpack Ministry – SYBA Mission to Harlan County, KY

Coordinator: Mary Jordan

In 2016, God called Doug and Debbie Prevette of Mt. Vernon Baptist Church to form a mission team with a special burden for the children of Harlan County, Kentucky—an area deeply impacted by the closure of the coal mines. These closures have led to economic hardship and limited opportunities for families, especially children. God led Doug and Debbie directly to the schools, where the needs were great and the doors were open.

In 2019, due to family matters, Debbie asked Ann DeHart and me to take on the leadership role. Since then, our mission goal has remained clear: **serve each school for three years**, working with the school's Resource Officer to identify needs and provide for the children.

Our mission work includes:

- Delivering backpacks, coats, and homemade hats and scarves to every child.
- Providing school supplies, blankets, and meal certificates for families in need.
- Sharing the love of Jesus through skits, personal conversations, salvation bracelets, and gospel materials.

Last year, 28 SYBA churches came together to provide over 600 backpacks, supplies, and volunteers. We served two schools and ministered to hundreds of children. In those sessions, **32 children accepted Jesus as their Savior**—and we connected them to local churches for follow-up discipleship.

God continues to open doors. Last year, we partnered with local churches in Harlan County for the first time and held a **Praise and Word service** the night before going into the schools. This year, He has provided two new schools—**Cumberland and Rosspoint Elementary**—with a combined need of **900 backpacks** along with children's coats, blankets, school supplies, and funds for food certificates.

Our current needs:

- Backpacks (900 total)
- Children's winter coats
- Blankets
- School supplies
- Funds for food certificates
- Transportation: We have one bus but need another to carry our 60+ missionaries to the second school.

Please join me in prayer for these needs, especially transportation, to be met so that we can bring God's love to every child.

BAPTISTS ON MISSION AREAS OF WORK

At Baptists on Mission, our Purpose is to Glorify God by involving churches and Christians in meeting human needs in Jesus' name. We do that by offering a wide variety of opportunities for volunteers to be the hands and feet of Jesus. Everything from aviation missions where we fly patients to much-needed medical care, partnership missions, prayer ministries, medical, dental, construction, disaster relief, disaster recovery, etc.

Baptists on Mission volunteers serve in 19 ministries that include the following:

STATE/NATIONAL/INTERNATIONAL MISSION PROJECTS

God is changing lives through mission trips sponsored by Baptists on Mission in North Carolina (mission camps, Impact NC, Disaster Rebuilds, etc.) and to places such as Pennsylvania, Hawaii, New England, Rocky Mountain Region, Appalachian Coalfields, Alaska, Guatemala, Kenya, Armenia, Romania, Hungary, Moldova, Cuba, South Africa and other places. Many hundreds of volunteers serve in these partnerships every year, with 173 teams and 2,395 volunteers participating in national partnerships and internationally we sent 84 teams and 702 volunteers to 10 difference countries.

Lives are being changed... The British missionary William Carey said, "Expect great things from God; attempt great things for God." Here are some of the things that we as NC Baptists have been doing to minister to people and to glorify God:

DISASTER RELIEF

Baptists on Mission are exceptionally well-prepared for disaster relief, thanks to the dedication of our volunteers and the comprehensive equipment we've been blessed with. Our capabilities are extensive, featuring five large disaster feeding units, two of which can prepare and serve over 30,000 meals daily. Beyond feeding, we have a vast network of more than 250 disaster recovery trailers, owned by local churches and associations, specifically designed for clean-up and repair work after an event. Our support services are robust, including six large shower units, three laundry units, a childcare unit, several large recovery units, and numerous generator units, all provided to aid communities in need. The profound impact of our efforts was clearly demonstrated after Hurricane Helene, where we provided 500,000 hot meals, performed mud-outs, tear-outs, and chainsaw jobs on over 5,000 homes, completed over 9,000 loads of laundry, and facilitated over 18,000 showers. This massive undertaking was made possible by the incredible commitment of over 13,000 volunteers who mobilized within the first three months of the response.

DISASTER REBUILD

North Carolina has been hit hard by several severe storms: Hurricane Florence in September 2018, Tropical Storm Fred in August 2021, and Hurricane Helene in 2024. These events affected thousands of families across our state. God has blessed us with six rebuild centers located in Black Mountain, Boone, Burnsville, East Flat Rock, and Spruce Pine. These centers are vital for housing, feeding, and coordinating the work of thousands of volunteers dedicated to rebuilding efforts. So far, we've helped over 2,000 families in eastern North Carolina and 330 families impacted by Helene in western North Carolina return home. However, many more families still need assistance to rebuild their lives years after these devastating storms. We will be rebuilding homes in western North Carolina for the next 5 years. Through our work, people in great need are experiencing the love of Christ, leading many to commit or recommit their lives to Jesus.

MEDICAL/DENTAL MISSIONS

Baptists on Mission offers the use of the mobile medical/dental units to Baptist and non-Baptist churches and service organizations within North Carolina who wish to reach out to people in need. More than 170 clinics are held each year on the 4 mobile units. Patients targeted through this ministry may include the impoverished, ethnic groups, farm workers, fair workers, the homeless, the elderly, and more.

HEALTH SCREENING MINISTRY

Health disparities are prevalent in more impoverished neighborhoods. Our goal is to take healthcare to the most disadvantaged populations, thus improving community health navigation as we align local community health centers with patients seen at the mobile clinics. The unit's health screening tests include Hemoglobin A1C for diabetes screening, finger stick glucose, Cholestech LDX for total cholesterol and HDL results, body mass index calculation, depression screening, basic eye exams, and vital signs assessment. This ministry provides not only basic health screening clinics but spiritual assessments and counseling as well. Our hope is that by meeting a physical need, a spiritual door will be opened, and the love of Jesus can be shared.

STUDENT MISSIONS

Deep Impact helps North Carolina Baptist churches develop a comprehensive, coed youth missions strategy to produce committed followers of Christ. This strategy includes pre-packaged mission weeks, weekend mission retreats and much more.

DI KIDS

One of our newest efforts is DI Kids (Deep Impact Kids), a missions weekend/week for children and their leaders. DI Kids Missions Weeks, Mini-weeks, and Weekends are pre-packaged mission experiences sponsored by Baptists on Mission. They provide elementary-age students and their leaders/parents with the opportunity to share the love of God with people in NC. The children enjoy a great camp experience with a mission focus. Involving children in missions is an excellent beginning to develop disciple-making students and adults with love for missions.

OTHER MINISTRIES

In addition to the ministries described above, other ministries of Baptists on Mission designed to equip, motivate and mobilize volunteers to be involved in missions are Agriculture Missions, Aviation Ministry, Baptist Builders, Baptist Educators, Family Foundations, Compassion Ministry, Church Renewal, Prayer Support, Sports and Recreation, Men's Ministry, Student Missions and Children's Missions.

MISSIONS CONFERENCE

The annual missions conference, sponsored by Baptists on Mission, includes music, testimonies, speakers, breakout sessions, mission fair exhibits, volunteer suppers, and much more. The desired end result is for participants to be spiritually renewed and inspired to become involved in missions locally and worldwide. Over 1,500 people attend this conference every year.

REGIONAL MISSIONS RALLIES

Each spring and fall, Baptists on Mission sponsors regional rallies in all 10 regions of our state. These meetings are designed to challenge North Carolina Baptists across the state to greater mission involvement and to promote the September North Carolina Missions Offering. The rallies are open for all men, women, and youth interested in missions.

BAPTISTS ON MISSION MAGAZINE

This publication is mailed twice each year to all church mission leaders, mission volunteers, BOM ministry groups, youth directors, ministers of education, and pastors. Information is provided through this magazine to promote upcoming mission projects/events and to report on recently completed projects.

MISSION CAMPS AND REBUILD CENTERS

Every year an average of 8,000 volunteers respond to needs through the Mission Camps in Red Springs, Shelby, and Rose Hill (Charity) and Rebuild Centers in Lumberton, New Bern and Canton. These Mission Camps and Rebuild Centers are a great way to get your church involved in life-changing mission projects and Glorify God.

Provision Financial Resources of NC Baptists (formerly the North Carolina Baptist Foundation) exists to encourage and enable faithful and wise financial stewardship for the glory of God and the good of the world. Provision provides a range of services to individuals, including free will/estate planning, investment opportunities, scholarships, and charitable giving. Provision has a strong partnership with Baptist churches and organizations. Through our partnerships, we help foster stewardship through stewardship education, ministry grants, and fund management. Provision also offers investment opportunities with our Impact Certificates, as well as loans to churches for upcoming building projects.

Highlights

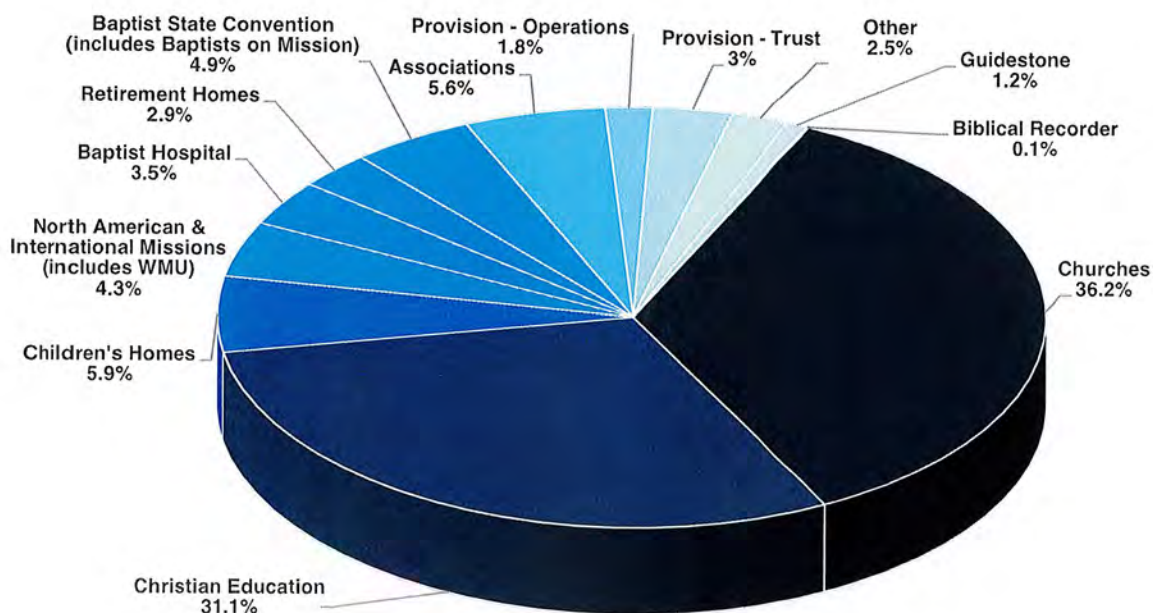
- In February 2024, Provision implemented a redemptive investing strategy that promotes human flourishing around the world. More information about redemptive investing can be found at provision.org/investing.
- Chris Jones joined the Provision Team as VP, Regional Director in June 2024, and Kevin Qualls was welcomed as EVP, Ministry Impact Strategies in November 2024. Sarah Welch also joined the team in December 2024 as Executive Assistant.
- Online statement access for account holders was launched in September 2024.
- Provision established the OneFund as a simplified way to support diverse Christian causes such as scholarships, adoption and foster care, disaster relief, church planting, and more. Through this unified giving effort, individuals, churches, and organizations can receive both ongoing support and immediate relief when needs arise.
- Renovations on the Provision office building in Cary began in June 2024 and were completed in March 2025.
- Provision relaunched the Donor-Advised Fund program and introduced a new online platform for efficiency and flexibility in giving.
- Provision continues to offer a free online estate planning resource that is available to all NC Baptists. To date, 180+ people have engaged with the resource, committing \$9.9 million to churches and other ministries through their estates.
- In 2024, Provision distributed \$9.9 million to NC Baptists.
- In 2024, Provision awarded 140 scholarships to NC Baptist students totaling \$251,900.
- In 2024, Provision awarded 60 ministry grants to NC Baptist churches and associations totaling \$84,711.
- In 2024, Provision closed 16 church loans totaling \$9.4 million.

Future Goals and Initiatives

- **The Co-Labor Initiative:** Provision will be sponsoring the Co-Labor Conference on Saturday, October 11, 2025, at Open Door Church in Raleigh. Co-Labor is an initiative

dedicated to equipping Baptists to integrate faith and work for the common good. More information about the initiative and the conference can be found at colaborinitiative.org.

- **Increase Online Access:** Move the application processes for church loans, ministry grants, and scholarships to a new platform, allowing applicants to apply online.
- **Scholarship Expansion:** Increase the number of scholarships to serve more NC Baptist students, expanding opportunities for education and ministry preparation.
- **Quarterly Grant Reviews:** Revise the Ministry Grant application process to address requests on a quarterly basis instead of an annual basis to assist in providing a timely response to ministry needs.

INTRODUCTION: Since 1885, the heart of Baptist Children's Homes of North Carolina (BCH) has beat with a rhythm of hope that now extends throughout NC, SC and Guatemala. Today, BCH reaches people of all ages including *vulnerable children (many in the NC foster care system), single mothers, expectant mothers, birth mothers, intellectually/developmentally disabled adults, aging adults, community families, and impoverished children in Guatemala*. Through the **EVERY CHILD Initiative** in partnership with NC Baptists, BCH comes alongside churches to train and license husbands and wives to be foster families and equip the church to provide support and ministry to them. We believe the church is the answer to ministering to the needs of the most vulnerable and "Plan A" for sharing with them the unconditional love of Jesus. *On mission together* with NC Baptists, a myriad of needs are met and the gospel is shared. **We are many ministries beating with one heart — the heartbeat of Jesus. He and his wife Tera moved from Georgia, where he served as Chief Operating Officer of the Georgia Baptist Mission Board. David brings a renewed focus for BCH to be a gospel-centered organization that brings hope to the vulnerable and comes alongside churches in their efforts to make the name of Jesus known.
- **BCH Adopts BF&M 2000:** In April 2025, the BCH Board approved the Baptist Faith & Message 2000 as BCH's official statement of faith, establishing a clear, Gospel-centered foundation for ministry and partnerships moving forward.
- **New Trainings Widen BCH's Ability to Equip and Empower Churches:**
Gospel-centered, trauma-informed trainings were developed so churches can compassionately care for the vulnerable and see discipleship flourish:
 - Children's and Youth Ministry Teams and congregations are empowered to launch and strengthen initiatives that foster resiliency, safety, and spiritual growth for families impacted by brokenness.
 - Leaders and volunteers are equipped to serve families impacted by

Autism Spectrum Disorder, building ministries of sensitivity & belonging.

- **Fifteen Birth Mothers Make Decisions for Christ:** Christian Adoption Services, a BCH ministry, offers the annual retreat to encourage birth mothers who have chosen adoption for their babies and share the hope of the Gospel with them.
- **Ride to Clyde Marks 10th Anniversary with Record Amount Raised:** Organized in partnership with NC Baptists and benefiting BCH, motorcyclists celebrated the milestone year by raising \$261,367.
- **Annual Offering 2025:** This year's offering theme is EVERY CHILD and focuses on the story God is writing in the hearts and lives of the Hinton Family and their incredible foster care journey. This year's goal is \$2 million. (See below).

God Brings Two Families Together through the Hintons' Foster Care Journey

Chad and Alicia Hinton were out of excuses. The couple sat in their home church, Englewood Baptist in Rocky Mount, where they had finished hearing a sermon series that would forever impact their family's direction. The messages included two Baptist Children's Homes (BCH) guest speakers who shared about the EVERY CHILD initiative, where BCH trains and licenses Christian husbands and wives to become foster parents. The couple, who live in Tarboro, knew God was leading them to foster vulnerable NC boys and girls in addition to raising their four biological children.

In late December 2022, the Hintons received a call that a newborn baby was in need of a foster family. On Christmas Eve, Chad remained home with their children while Alicia drove to the hospital and held baby Ian in her arms for the first time.

In the days ahead, Chad and Alicia connected with Ian's great aunt and uncle who were raising Ian's two half-sisters. A friendship evolved between the two families—one that allowed Ian to know his biological family.

Chad and Alicia's plan to foster as many children as possible arrived at a crossroads when they learned Ian would be eligible for adoption. When they discussed this with Ian's great aunt and uncle, they all agreed that the bond formed between their two families was special. Adopting Ian has allowed their relationship to grow stronger and ensure he and his siblings would be involved in each other's lives.

Ian became a permanent member of the Hinton Family in February 2023. They hosted an adoption celebration at their church where family—including 10 members of Ian's biological family—friends, and BCH team members attended.

Today, the Hintons have moved into a bigger home—one that allows them the room to foster more children and have space for future sleepovers with Ian's sisters. The Hintons see this as an extension of the ministry God has given them through the EVERY CHILD initiative and the support of NC Baptists including the Annual Offering.

BAPTIST RETIREMENT HOMES FOUNDATION

2025 Annual Report to Baptist Churches and Associations

Greetings from Baptist Retirement Homes Foundation! We are grateful to share updates from our past year which brings us to 75 years of ministry and missional support to older adults in North Carolina. Again, this year we have seen growth and outstanding performance ratings in our communities and among our staff members.

As the need for quality senior living facilities continues to grow, we have thoughtfully responded with well-planned projects to increase the available homes in our communities. Earlier this year ThriveMore announced plans for Brice Pointe, its newest life plan community in New Bern. This community has been received well and is currently in the initial development phase.

Additionally, cottages and apartments have been added to the campus at Taylor Glen in Concord which will add fifty new residences to their community. Taylor House in Albemarle is receiving upgrades and updates to better accommodate the residents and staff, while preserving the historic value of the building. At Brookridge in Winston-Salem, we are building an intergenerational childcare center that will not only provide enrichment for our residents but also quality, affordable childcare options for our campus staff. And at Ardenwoods in Arden, we raised over \$60,000 dollars to directly support our staff who suffered varying degrees of loss due to the destruction of Hurricane Helene.

Our Immeasurably More Campaign has been announced and we are receiving outstanding feedback for our plans to build the first Green House model of care to North Carolina on the Taylor Glen campus. THE GREEN HOUSE® Project's philosophy prioritizes resident autonomy and dignity and empowers the lives of the people who serve and support the residents. Our second project offers couple's memory care homes that allow couples managing a memory care diagnosis to spend days and nights together, with the caregiving spouse having around-the-clock access to trained and dedicated staff. This patent-pending design will be the first of its kind in the nation, and has already received national recognition for its innovative design and solution to vital needs of aging adults with memory loss.

Our ThriveMore at Home Program, offered in the Raleigh and surrounding area, has enrolled 29 independent older adults who have chosen to age in place in their home. This program offers members a lifetime promise of care and services at the high standard demonstrated in our legacy of caring for North Carolina seniors.

In September of 2024 we welcomed Kevin Cook as the new Director of Development for Baptist Retirement Homes Foundation. Kevin brings a wealth of experience in development and fundraising and has made a great impact in moving our department forward. We look forward to adding additional team members later this year who will support our communication work and support the overall mission of our organization.



BAPTIST RETIREMENT HOMES FOUNDATION

Across all of our communities, we provided over \$3,241,000 in aid to 52 individuals in our most recent fiscal year. We cared for 37 individuals at the Brookdridge health care facility who needed financial aid and whose average length of stay was 187 days. In the last year, ThriveMore provided financial assistance to 14 residents of our Taylor House assisted living community- providing them the security of "home" regardless of their financial situation. Finally, our Medicine from the Heart program has assisted over 100 seniors on Medicare this year by paying the copays for vital medication they otherwise couldn't afford. This program, based 100% on donations, supplemented close to \$20,000 in the past year.


